

Tips on Pedestrian Safety

Students should walk on sidewalks when they are provided.

In areas where sidewalks are not provided, students should walk on the left side of the roadway, facing oncoming traffic.

Students should cross streets at intersections utilizing crosswalks whether they are provided or unpainted.

Students should utilize traffic control devices where provided. (Traffic signals, Pedestrian walk buttons, crosswalks, etc.)

Students should never cross the street between cars.

Students should always look in all directions before crossing the street.

Students should not listen to headphones when walking.

Most importantly, students should always know their surrounding and watch out for other traffic. Be prepared to STOP!



Tips of Bicycle Safety

Students should NOT use their cell phone while riding.

Students should only ride bicycles that are the right size for them.

Students should always inspect their bicycles before riding.

Bicycles should be equipped with a white light on the front, red light on the rear, reflectors and audible warning device.

Students must always obey traffic signs and signals and related traffic laws.

Students under the age of 17 must wear a properly fitted and fastened bicycle helmet.

Students should not carry passengers, except when equipped with authorized seating.

Students should ride on the right side of the roadway, with traffic and yield to traffic coming up behind you.

Students should use both hands when riding,

Students should give pedestrians the right of way.

Students should always ride single file.

Students should wear light and/or bright clothing when riding. Reflective clothing is suggested.



Students should not listen to headphones while riding.

Students must always stop before leaving or entering traffic from driveways, sidewalks, parking lots, or alleyways. Students must always look in all directions (Look left, right, and left again). Only enter roadway when you know there is no traffic.

Students must always use proper directional signals when turning. Only turn when it is safe to do so.

Most importantly, students should always know their surrounding and watch out for other traffic. Be prepared to STOP!

Tips for Using Crosswalks with Crossing Guards:

Students should always obey the directions of the School Crossing Guard

Students should always walk across the street- You should not run, ride bicycles or skateboards, etc.

Students must always be alert for traffic and prepared to STOP and return to the curb.

Students must remember that drivers do not always pay attention to the roadway or traffic.

Students should always report suspicious activity to School Crossing Guards or School Officials.
